WHO SHOULD APPLY?



Children born between **1 September 2020 & 31 August 2021** start primary school in the reception class September 2025

Education, Health and Care Plans (EHCP)

There is a different process for children who have or are likely to get an EHCP. See the guide for more information.









1 September 2024 Applications open

Wednesday 15 January 2025 National deadline to apply

LATE APPLICATIONS

Applications submitted after 15 January will be considered late

Late applications are **seriously disadvantaged**

If there were exceptional reasons that prevented you applying before the closing date you must tell us before Wednesday 12 February 2025 and provide evidence.

Applications received after 12 February will be considered late regardless of the circumstances.

APPLYING ONLINE

Two stage process

- 1. Register parent details and confirm email address.
- 2. Enter child details and preferences
 SUBMIT

Changing the application – EASY !

make changes until midnight on 15 January **SUBMIT**, a confirmation email is sent each time

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HOME ADDRESS

Use the address where the child is living on the closing date (15 January)



If the child lives at two addresses (e.g. where the parents are separated and share responsibility) use the address where the child sleeps and spends most time from Monday to Friday

Ask the admissions team if you are unsure what address to use **before** submitting your application.

If you give false or misleading information about your address the school place may be withdrawn even after school starts.



MOVING HOUSE

If you move house after submitting your application tell the admissions team immediately.



We need proof that you live at the new address e.g. exchange of contracts letter or a signed tenancy agreement AND a utility or council tax bill.

Tell us by 5 February 2025 for the new address to be used when processing your application. If you tell us after 5 February, we will only be able to use the new address to adjust your child's position on the waiting list after offer day (16 April 2025)



EXTRA DOCUMENTATION



Proof of address is ** NOT REQUIRED **

Your details are checked against council tax and other council records. If we can't confirm your address we may ask you to provide proof.

You will need to provide documentation if you are applying under the following criteria:

- Looked after or previously looked after
- Child protection plan
- Medical and/or social reasons

WHO GETS PRIORITY FOR PLACES?

Each school has a maximum number of children they can admit into Reception. This is the 'published admission number' (PAN).

Schools with more applications than places use **admissions criteria** to decide who has priority for the places.

Schools use their published admissions criteria to rank all the applications to their school and places are offered to those at the top of the ranking first.

ADMISSION CRITERIA FOR COMMUNITY SCHOOLS

Children with an Education Health and Care Plan naming the school.

- 1. Children in care or previously in care, including children in state care outside of England, but immediately after being looked after became subject to an adoption, child arrangements or special guardianship order.
- 2. Children with a child protection plan.
- 3. Children with exceptional medical and/or social need to attend a particular school (evidence from a professional required).
- 4. Children with brothers or sisters at the school who live within 0.75 miles of the school.
- 5. Children of staff (maximum 1 child per class).
- 6. Children living nearest to the school (using straight line distance)



How do preferences work?

Each school you list is given **equal** consideration no matter what preference you list it.

It is **only the admissions criteria** that determine who has priority (the school doesn't know the preference number when they rank applications).

So why do parents have to rank the schools in order of preference?

The preference ranking is **only used by the admissions team** when a child qualifies for a place at more than one school. The child will be offered the highest preference.



PREFERENCES EXAMPLE

I have older twin boys at London Fields (sibling link) .. but I want the younger child to remain at the school where they are in the nursery (Gayhurst)

... but if I can't get Gayhurst ... then I want London Fields?

Do I have to put London Fields as my first preference to get a place? Will there be spaces left if I put London Fields as a lower preference? Will London Fields fill up with children who put it as first preference?

NO! London Fields can be last in the ranking without risking a place The school rank applications based on admissions criteria only The school don't know the preference rank of any application



PREFERENCES EXAMPLE

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OK .. I want Gayhurst ... but if I can't get that school then I want London Fields?

Solution :: Solution : Solutio

If I don't get Gayhurst ... what school do I want?
London Fields - then list as the second preference ...

Preference	School	Criteria
1	Gayhurst	Distance
2	London Fields	Sibling

THE ORDER OF YOUR PREFERENCES

You must list schools you want in preference order. This will ensure that where possible, the admissions team offer your child the school you want the most.

So what should parents do?

List the school you want the most as your first preference. Your second preference should be the school you prefer if you don't get the first preference, and so on down their list of preferences.

**** don't over-complicate it ****

Listing only one school or listing a school 1st preference does not increase the chance of being offered a place.



OFFER DAY - 16 APRIL 2025

Offer emails are sent on the evening of 16 April 2025.

The offer email has detailed information about how to respond and all your options eg waiting lists, appeals etc.

The offer will be for the highest ranked school on your application that is able to offer a place.

If it is not possible to offer your child a place at any of your preferred schools, they will normally be offered a place at the nearest Hackney school to your home **that has vacancies remaining**.
